- A Lifetime Of Heartache
- The Sacrifice Of His Dignity
- Not Just A Wife, But Her Children – Hos 2:1
- Why Would God Ask Such A Thing?
  - Hosea Represents What God Himself Has Done – Ex 32:1-35; Hos 1:2b
  - The Only Way To Open “Blind” Eyes – Prov 30:20; Is 5:20
- The Reason: The Land Has Departed From The Lord

### 2. Gomer And Her Children - Hos 1:3-9

- Jezreel: An Accursed Land – Hos 1:3-5
  - An Infamous Place, Symbolic Of Bloodshed Itself
  - A Place Of Man’s Continual Striving And War
  - A Place Of Defiance Against God
  - A Place Of God’s Sovereign Judgment
- Lo-Ruhama: No Mercy – Hos 1:6
  - The Same Sentence For Israel As For Canaan – Gen 15:16; Deut 7:2
- Mercy Still For The House Of Judah - Hos 1:7
- You Are Not My People, And I Am Not Your God – Hos 1:8-9
  - Lo-Ammi - “Not My People” – Hos 1:8-9a
  - Lo-Ehyeh – “Not I Am” – Hos 1:9b; Ex 3:14; 19:5-6
  - The Ancient Legal Language Of Divorce

## II. Speaking Through His Children - Hos 2:1-2

1. The Message They Are Given
  - Mercy And Fellowship – Hos 2:1; 1 John 1:1-4
  - Rebuke And Repentance – Hos 2:2; 1 John 1:5-10
2. They Are Now The Only Common Ground - Ex 32:1-8; 33:1-17; 34:29-35
3. Bring Charges Against Your Mother! - Hos 2:2
  - Rib: Plead, Rebuke, Contend
    - Public Disputes Rather Than Private Ones
    - A Judicial Setting, Such As A Courtroom
  - She Is Not My Wife, And I Am Not Her Husband
    - The Ancient Legal Language Of Divorce
    - Illocutionary Language
      - Can Have The Force Of A Warning
      - Something That Is Effectively Or Practically True Now

1. The Only Remaining Option - Hos 2:2
  - Let Her Put Away Her Harlotries From Her Sight
    - Let Her Get Rid Of Her Adulterous Countenance
  - And Her Adulteries From Between Her Breasts
    - May It No Longer Be Her Defining Essence And Characteristic

2. Neither Confused Nor Weakened By Emotional Manipulation – Hos 2:4-5a
3. She Has Played The Harlot – Hos 2:5b
  - I Will Go After My Lovers
    - Who Were Her Lovers?
      - Other Nations
      - Other Peoples
      - Other Gods
    - What Was She Going After?
      - Their Counsel, Guidance And Wisdom Rather Than God
      - Their Authority And Headship And Not God's
  - They Have Given Me All My Blessings
4. I Will Wall Her In – Hos 2:6-7a
  - Like Dumb Livestock In A Sty
5. The Result Her Husband Seeks - Hos 2:7b
  - Not Repentance, But Self-Serving Logic
  - She Wants To Take Care Of Herself.
  - She Knows He Can Provide Her Basic Needs.
  - She Knows He Will Provide Her Basic Needs.
